

Edwin Pratt Memorial Park Concept

The temporary sign for the Edwin Pratt Memorial Park was installed this week following a cross-departmental effort to remove blackberries and mow the property! Staff are working with a consultant to perform some preliminary public outreach and develop a high-level conceptual design for the property as well as a site survey.



Westminster Park Concept

The temporary sign for Westminster Park was also installed this week, and we have executed a contract for demolition, which is scheduled for June. Site assessment and conceptual design efforts will occur after demolition.

Shoreline Pool Demolition & Shoreline Park Pavilion

All pool assets have been auctioned and staff are planning for demolition, which will likely occur in September. We are partnering with Shoreline Fire to provide them with a fire training opportunity at the pool before it is demolished.

Shoreline was also successful in receiving a State Department of Commerce grant to fund the construction of a Pavilion on the site of the Shoreline Pool. We are exploring design options to potentially include portions of the Shoreline Pool building in the Pavilion versus purchasing a prefab pavilion on the KCDA contract. We are also working with Shoreline School District to update the Joint Use Agreement.



Park Restroom Rehabs

The State Department of Commerce also awarded the City a grant to rehab several of our aging restrooms. City staff have developed a cost-effective program for this work and have been refurbishing park restrooms over the past few years. This grant completes the remaining eight restrooms in our system.

All surfaces and finishes will be refurbished and epoxy coated, along with the addition of new partitions and restroom accessories. This work will be done over the coming summer months and portable restrooms and sanitation will be provided. Please see attachment for locations.

Richmond Highlands Recreation Center Roof, Fire Suppression System and Multi-Sport Court

Another State Department of Commerce Grant is providing funding to help support the replacement of the Richmond Highlands Recreation Center roof and install a fire suppression system.

The Recreation Center was built in 1911, last received a major renovation in 2001, and provides 6,650 square feet of recreation program space. The roof has outlived its useful life, and the building does not have a fire sprinkler system.

The project is estimated to start on June 1, 2021 and end on September 7, 2021 and will extend the life of the building and make it a safer program space for program participants and visitors. Programing will shift from this facility to the Richmond Beach Artist Studio Cottage, which was recently renovated for the summer.

Another State Grant is providing funding to install a Modular Outdoor Sport Court that provides a portable multi-sport court, hoop and ball containment/fencing system. The court tiles are made from recycled plastic. It will first be installed at the Recreation Center parking lot and can be moved around the City as program opportunities arise. It is scheduled to be in place and in use by June 15.

#### Kruckeberg Caretaker Cottage Demolition

The former carriage house/cottage is in the process of being hand deconstructed so as not to impact the living exhibits or the visitor experience. Estimated completion is September. The site will be prepared for a future plaza and restroom consistent with the master plan.

#### Innis Arden Reserve Gate

Park staff cleared vegetation to make way for a security gate keeping unwanted visitors out of the reserve after dark.

#### Highland Plaza Demo and Paving

Jerseys moved to their new location in Shoreline at the end of March, and staff are actively preparing for demolition of the building and installation of additional parking. Demolition is scheduled for June and paving is scheduled for July. The Fire Department has also taken the opportunity to use this building for fire training purposes over the last month.
