





Within five minutes of being dispatched, Deputy Bookin responded. When they saw him walk into the lobby, they immediately looked relieved, and were thankful to speak with a LEO in person. Deputy Bookin took a report, answered their questions, and provided guidance.*

CSO Corona also responded and shared additional social service programs and other resources to help her.

**Deputy Bookin and CSO Corona provided excellent service with professionalism and empathy. They made a positive impact on the RP's life and improved her sense of safety.**
