

## Shoreline - Leading in New IIU Process

This week, Shoreline is believed to be the first precinct to successfully close an IIU complaint through a new process that allows us to refer persons to resources in lieu of a traditional IIU investigation. This case stemmed from a man trespassed at St. Dunstan's. He demonstrated obvious behavioral health challenges that kept him from understanding the trespass warning. Our four partners performed well and demonstrated the patience and compassion our community expects.

IIU and OLEO concurred with an expedited closing and allowed us to refer the case to Sherry/RCCR. Our four involved partners should receive letters shortly advising them the matter is now closed.

IIU's new approach to expedited findings is the product of Chief Park and others who shared a vision that the IIU process could be streamlined for matters just like this. It took time to launch, but we're hopeful Shoreline's early success will be roadmap for similar cases and be a lasting improvement on this process.
