## Chief's Message



Greetings Shoreline Crime Fighters,

Due to some scheduling conflicts at the end of the week, we are putting the WIR out a bit early this week. First things first. I would like to welcome Sgt. Dusty Davis to our team. He is assigned to 2A and brings a ton of experience with him to Shoreline. When you get a moment, please stop by and welcome him to Shoreline.

Moving on to a WA Supreme Court action that will immediately impact the way we do business. The Court has deemed that prosecutors have to arraign all defendants who are booked into jail—even if they are released on conditions—within three business days of the filing of charges. Effective immediately, to help the prosecutor's office notify victims of arraignment dates, they need **current**, accurate, and complete information on how to contact the victims **electronically** at the time of the defendant's booking.

Specifically, they will need the following information about the victims at the time of a defendant's booking:

- Name
- Physical address
- Cell phone number
- Email address
- Any language preferences/needs
- Preferred primary method of contact (cell, email, etc.)
- An additional emergency contact if possible

This change goes into effect for the prosecutor's office on 09/01/2025. Please start doing this immediately. We need to ensure that we are providing all of this information to the prosecutor's office when we turn our reports in.

## **RCR and Police Partner to Secure Supportive Housing**

Clyde has been living homeless in Shoreline for years and is familiar to many deputies. He has faced challenges related to emotional regulation and independent management of his medical needs and has occasionally required additional support in interpersonal interactions. In June, RCR referred him to the Oaks. While waiting, Clyde was admitted to the hospital where all the toes on his left foot were amputated. When the Oaks had an opening, Clyde had lost his phone, and we weren't able to locate him to let him know there was a spot. He had left the hospital against medical advice and his whereabouts were unknown. Thankfully, Deputy Schettler sent Clyde to the hospital after he decided to block traffic along Aurora in protest of the medical system.

Deputy Schettler let us know where he was, and RCR was able to coordinate communication between the ER social worker and the Oaks. He was discharged straight to the Oaks where they completed an intake, and he was able to get a room that night. He has been living there successfully the last couple weeks, and now he has a permanent supported housing apartment approved at Aurora House at 105<sup>th</sup> and Aurora. He is expected to move in next week. I visited with Clyde today and he expressed his gratitude toward RCR and to all the deputies at Shoreline PD who have tried to look out for him.
