Violent Crimes and Trafficking Detective - Finan

- Completed 9 outside agency assists relating to social media, gang, and human trafficking intelligence
- Completed the 4-day Child Forensic Interview Course
- Attended the CNOA conference in San Diego with members of CID
- Assisted SPD VICE Det. Mo Washington with intel relating to the strip club at 103 & Aurora which has purportedly been used to traffic juveniles. Finan's intel helped Det. Washington obtain a search warrant to go into the club and attempt to rescue any juveniles.
- KCSO Assists:
 - Assisted MCU Det. Bruce with intel on gang members likely involved with her robbery and shooting from Spring of 2025
 - Assisted Metro Det. McCaw with intel on juvenile trafficking victims associated with her case
 - Looked into a complaint made by multiple Shoreline citizens about a sex offender living in Shoreline who was potentially grooming new victims via a bible study class at a Shoreline church. Finan was able to obtain specific details about the former doctor and his crimes. He found social media posts relating to a possible protest of the church he is/was attending and alerted the Shoreline admin. Met with one of the complainants but determined there was no evidence that any new specific crimes had been committed.
